



## Kodkod

Cabernet Sauvignon **2023**

### Grape Varieties

**85% Cabernet Sauvignon:** The “Las Casas” vineyard was established before 1900 according to official records and has never been grafted. 7% Carménère and 8% Syrah add complexity. The grapes were hand-harvested on March 8th.

### Appellation

The vineyards are located on gentle slopes of the Coastal Range, with colluvial soils and a Mediterranean climate, about one kilometer from the Maule River. They are managed with cover crops and without pesticides.

### Winemaking and History

A gentle carbonic maceration was carried out, then fermentation was done in bins, half using native yeasts, subsequently it went into third-use French oak barrels for 16 months until the bottling of only 1264 bottles on July 26, 2024.

Santa Rosa de Lavaderos is in a valley protected by the first hills of the Coastal Mountain Range, the rivers Maule and Loncomilla. In these hills, the family that owns the farm has a natural reservation of native forest, where among other vulnerable species dwells the Kodkod (the smallest wild cat of the world).

### Tasting notes and press

The three previous vintages have all received 94 points in the “Descorchados Guide” (since this wine was first published). The 2023 vintage achieved 93 points: *“The aromas are distinctly fruity, with some herbal notes, but especially ripe and delightful red fruits; the palate is sweet, with ripe tones accompanied by those crisp tannins that are part of Cabernet Sauvignon's genetic makeup.”*

The “Las Casas” Cabernet Sauvignon vineyard block was featured on [jancisrobinson.com](http://jancisrobinson.com) in August 2022, highlighting the world's oldest vines, and the 2019 vintage scored 17.5/20.

### Technical details

A wine made in a "classic" style, with notes of spices, red fruit, and herbs. Its acidity keeps it fresh and allows it to age well until at least 2030.

Kodkod 2023

Syrah

### Grape Varieties

**100% Syrah:** Un-grafted vineyards, managed with cover crops and without chemical pesticides. Handpicked on March 1st.

### Appellation

The vineyards are planted on gentle slopes of the hills of the Coastal Range on colluvial soils. Less than a kilometer away from the Maule River.

### Winemaking and History

Santa Rosa de Lavaderos is in a valley protected by the first hills of the Coastal Mountain Range, the rivers Maule and Loncomilla. In these hills, our family has a natural reservation of native forest, where among other vulnerable species dwells the Kodkod (the smallest wild cat of the world).

Is a place where every farmer had a vineyard and produced wine, we are part of this tradition.

### Tasting notes and technical details

This wine was fermented in bins with controlled temperatures and punch-downs, then it was aged in third-use French oak barrels until it was bottled (unfiltered) in July, 2024. Only 781 bottles made. It has aromas of flowers like violets, a full-bodied wine that can be enjoyed in 2024 or stored for several years.

TA: 6,22, Residual Sugar: 2.56 g/L



### Press

We made wine of the same grapes the years 2012 and 2013, we still have some of these bottles and they are outstanding.

## País / Mission Young Red Wine

Vintage 2024

### Grape Varieties

100% País/Mission Un-grafted, head pruned vineyards and established before 1900 according to official records. They were hand-harvested on March 15th.

### Appellation

Gentle hills of the Coastal Range, with colluvial soils and a Mediterranean climate, about one kilometer from the Maule River.

### Winemaking and History

Santa Rosa de Lavaderos is in a valley protected by the first hills of the Coastal Mountain Range, the rivers Maule and Loncomilla. In these hills, the family that owns the farm has a natural reservation of native forest, where among other vulnerable species dwells the Kodkod (the smallest wild cat of the world).

In the valley, each small owner had vineyards with País/Mission grapes, the first variety to reach America from Europe. Recently some producers are reviving this grape full of history and tradition.

### Tasting notes and technical details

Fermented with native yeasts and aged for a few months in two used French oak barrels, the 535 bottles were bottled in July 2024. Typical fennel aromas of the variety. A characterful and flavorful País/Mission wine, ideal for charcuterie.

### Specialized Review

This wine achieved 93 points in the specialized magazine “Descorchados” in the 2022 and 2023 vintages. The 2020 vintage received 18/20 in an article about old vineyards on jancisrobinson.com and was among the one hundred wines in the article “This Year’s Most Amazing Wines Under \$20” by “Wine Enthusiast” magazine.



## Kodkod

País / Mission still red wine 2023

### Grape varieties

95% País and 5% Carignan. Un-grafted, head-pruned vineyards were established before 1900 according to official records. Hand-harvested on February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

### Appellation

The vineyards are planted on gentle slopes of the hills of the Coastal Range, less than one kilometer away from the Maule River. For this wine, a particular area of the vineyards was chosen, with small and perfectly ripe berries.

### Winemaking and History

Santa Rosa de Lavaderos is a family-owned farm in a valley protected by the first hills of the Coastal Mountain Range, the rivers Maule and Loncomilla. In these hills, there's a reservation of native forest, where among other vulnerable species dwells the Kodkod (the smallest wild cat in the world).

In the valley, each small owner had vineyards with País grapes, the first variety to reach America from Europe. This wine was carefully made by a third-generation family member.

### Technical details

### Tasting notes and Press

Aromas of fennel. A flavorful wine with lots of character, with a subtle touch of French Oak due to barrel aging.

The 2022 and 2023 versions of this wine received 93 points by "Descorchados". The 2020 vintage achieved 18/20 in an Old Vineyards article at jancisrobinson.com, and also was featured in "This Year's Most Amazing Wines Under \$20", from "Wine Enthusiast".

## País Rosé

Harvest 2024

### Grape varieties

100% País: Un-grafted, head-pruned vineyards, managed with cover crops and without chemical pesticides, they were established before 1900 according to official records. Hand-harvested on March 15th.

### Appellation

The vineyards are planted on gentle slopes of the hills of the Coastal Range on colluvial soils. About a kilometer away from the Maule River.

### Winemaking and History

Santa Rosa de Lavaderos is in a valley protected by the first hills of the Coastal Mountain Range, the rivers Maule and Loncomilla. In these hills, our family has a natural reservation of native forest, where among other vulnerable species dwells the Kodkod (the smallest wild cat of the world).

Is a place where every farmer had a vineyard and produced wine, we are part of this tradition.

### Tasting notes and technical details

This wine was fermented in bins using the native yeast of the grapes, then it was kept for few months in a third-use French oak barrel until it was bottled (unfiltered) in July 2024. Only 230 bottles made. Floral and toasted bread aromas, a fresh wine to be enjoyed at about 46°F

pH: 3.16

TA: 6,82

Residual Sugar: 2.01 g/L



### Press

Our last version of Rosé was made of Cabernet Sauvignon. This is the first time we use the País grape and native yeasts; we plan to keep the recipe!
